Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm

The minutes of 6-3-13 were approved unanimously without changes with a motion from George Solley

We discussed the proposal from the Wetlands Board that asked to change the ordinance on litter to a class 1 misdemeanor instead of class 4. George Solley will contact Kathleen Dooley to research next steps.

Mike Ward explained the new Park and Recreation initiative to stop smoking in Parks. Signs have been posted to ask people not to smoke in parks.

Paula Chow explained the fall campaign for "Butts are Litter Too" that will be conducted in partnership with the University of Mary Washington. That campaign kicks off in mid September.

We discussed the cigarette butt receptacles in downtown and the challenges that we are seeing; broken, stolen, not being used, etc. We will go back and try to come up with a better plan and report back to the commission.

Diane Jones from the R Board discussed the litter grant money and how our commission can access some of these funds. We will be using some of these funds for dog bags for the dog stations and recycle bins for Hugh Mercer and Walker Grant schools for the classrooms.

George Solley suggested we make another effort to talk to the schools about recycling. Diane will work with us to increase our efforts.

We discussed the café ordinance and the standards and how to get better compliance. More information needed on this.
